Curriculum Development:

HADE 115: Introduction to Epidemiology

This course is designed to equip students with the skills to link epidemiological theory to population health and therapy and apply in health service and decision making. The course covers the essential knowledge that health service managers and planners need, concerning epidemiology and population health. It is to enable students to apply the analytical strategies of epidemiology to health service environment and be able to assess, interpret and carefully evaluate the quality of evidence of health service studies. The course will also provide students with an opportunity to calculate and interpret measures of disease frequency, morbidity, and their impact.

HADE 351: Research Methods in Health Administration

The Research methods has been put together to impart the necessary skills and knowledge required to undertake a thesis and research project at the bachelor's level.

- 1. Research Methods 1: The Research Question: Student will learn how to develop a clear, focused, and feasible research question relevant to Heath Administration and Education. And also learn how to conduct background and a supporting literature review. Additionally, they will learn how to conduct a systematic review and the main differences between a systematic and literature review. By the end of the section, students will develop their research project's research question and familiarize themself with the relevant background literature.
- 2. Research Methods 2: The Study Design: Will learn about the different methods and methodologies that could be utilized to answer a specific research question chosen by them. These involve the use of quantitative methods (secondary and primary data for analysis), qualitative method (e.g., thematic analysis), survey design and mixed methods. They will develop their methodology (if applicable) by writing a research proposal for your tentative research project.
- 3. Research Methods 3: Core Research Skills: They will learn about the practical aspects of research including research ethics, plagiarism, data management, and public involvement.
- 4. Research Methods 4: Research in Practice: Based on their learning from the previous lessons, they should be able to conduct a research project including data collection (if applicable), data analysis and dissemination. By the end of the course, they will have completed their research project, with the summative assessments being approximately a 2000-word Academic writing and a 5-minute vlog describing their project to a lay audience.

This course is designed to equip students with the skills to identify the major forces that influence the health of individuals and populations around the world, articulate an understanding of the complexity of global health issues, especially in low-resource settings, identify the risk factors that affect disease burden. And also to articulate the role of CPH nurses as advocates for improving the health of patients and populations in their communities and around the world, discuss the epidemiological transition, identify the Top Ten Best Buys of Public Health, identify key International, Intergovernmental and Non-governmental Agencies engaged in global health efforts and Discuss the eight Millennium Development goals and the 17 sustainable development goals.
